Dear Friend in Christ,

This has certainly been a remarkable and trying year in so many different ways. From the pandemic to divisive politics to racial unrest, we seem to be getting it from all angles in 2020. These challenges make me wonder what tomorrow holds and what we can do now to heal all that divides us and make a brighter future, especially for our young people. While I cannot claim to have come up with a solution to eliminate the many challenges facing our society, I am nonetheless convinced that Catholic schools do have a substantial impact in not only improving the lives of those who attend, but also in improving entire communities in which they exist.

We have something incredible to offer in our Catholic schools: academic excellence combined with a solid formation of the human person in the Gospel values. The results speak for themselves. Overall, more than 95% of Catholic school graduates go on to college. And with a degree in hand, many stay local and contribute in countless ways to our community. Affectionately called PIE, this initiative plays a vitally important role in giving children access to a Catholic education, particularly those from low and moderate-income households in the City of Baltimore. PIE has helped more than 12,000 children to do just that for 25 years now.

And while we may not have enough Catholic schools to accommodate that dream, we have plenty of capacity in our existing schools and plenty of families who would love to enroll their children. *I am appealing to you today to help more children get in the door.*
